The Tempest



Year 6 put on an excellent performance of Shakespeare's *The Tempest* this term. The singing, dancing, acting, costumes, set and lighting were fantastic. Children also rose to the challenge of learning lines from the original play.



Year 3/4 Why is the planet so blue? Children in Year 3 and 4 have been learning all about the oceans this term. They visited the Blue Planet Aquarium and saw sharks, stingrays, poisonous frogs and an octopus!

Also, as part of this topic, children have been finding out about plastic in the oceans and the impact of plastic pollution.

Year 2 Peak Wild Life Park Year 2 visited the Peak Wildlife Park as part of their 'Let's go on safari' topic. They learned about the different animals and even had the chance to pet pigs, goats and giant rabbits!



Food waste and recycling – what a load of rubbish!

Do you know how much food we waste? Do you know what weighs a ton? Do you know what happens to our food waste? These were some of the questions children were exploring in a whole school assembly led by Alliance Environmental Services through High Peak Borough Council.

Year 5 – Countryside Learning Year 5 took part in a countryside learning experience at the Goyt Valley earlier this term.

Among the activities were: moors for the future, healthy peat bogs, wildlife management, water cycle, Peak Park Rangers, fire watch, upland sheep farming, habitat management and wild fires, Police and rural crime.
